MONDAY - SUNDAY

DAY 0: SUNDAY - DEPART FROM THE USA

SIGHTSEEING/FEATURES IN PACKAGE:

GIANTS CAUSEWAY



Location: Bushmills, Co. Antrim, Northern Ireland.

What is it: Northern Ireland's first UNESCO World Heritage Site.

It is over 40,000 basalt columns, formed some 60 million years ago, forming over the Atlantic Ocean.

TITANIC MUSEUM



Location: Belfast City, Northern Ireland

What is it: The Titanic Museum in Belfast, officially known as Titanic Belfast, is a world-renowned visitor attraction located in heart of the Titanic Quarter, where the RMS Titanic was designed, built and launched. It tells the story of the tragic sinking of the ship on her maiden voyage in 1912.

GUINNESS STOREHOUSE



Location: Dublin, Ireland

What is it: The Guinness Storehouse is Ireland's most popular tourist attraction, offering an immersive journey through the history and craft of Guinness. Set in a seven-story former fermentation plant, the tour ends with a pint and panoramic view of Dublin from the Gravity Bar.

CROKE PARK EXPERIENCE

TRINITY COLLEGE (BOOK OF KELLS)

WALKING TOUR OF DUBLIN

CRUMLIN ROAD GOAL

Location: North Belfast, Northern Ireland

What is it: Known as 'Europe's Alcatraz', Crumlin Road Goal is a former prison steeped in history, having held political prisoners, witnessed executions, and played a key role during some of Ireland's most turbulent times.

BELFAST CITY HALL



Location: Belfast City, Ireland

What is it: Belfast City Hall is a stunning Baroque-style building at the heart of the city, symbolizing Belfast's rich industrial heritage and civic pride. Opened in 1906, its features architecture, beautiful stained-glass windows, and landscaped gardens.

BELFAST CHRISTMAS MARKET



Location: Belfast City Hall, Northern Ireland

What is it: Set against the stunning backdrop of Belfast City Hall, the festive village brings together over 100 local and international traders, offering a charming selection of handcrafted gifts, gourmet Christmas treats, and unique artisan creations.

QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY BELFAST



Location: Belfast City, Northern Ireland

What is it: Queen's University Belfast is a prestigious institution founded in 1845, known for its beautiful red-brick Lanyon Building, leafy campus, and vibrant student atmosphere. Located in the heart of South Belfast, it's a hub of academic excellence and cultural heritage.

STORMONT BUILDING

KILMAINHAM GOAL

What is it: Kilmainham Gaol is one of Ireland's most powerful historic sites, where leaders of Irish rebellions were imprisoned and, in some cases, executed. A guided tour through its cold stone corridors offers a haunting yet inspiring look at Ireland's fight for independence, making it a must-visit for history lovers.

JAMESON DISTILLERY
